Application is complete, shows attention to detail, and is well-written.

Motivation & Seriousness

The application must demonstrate a seriousness of purpose and clear reasons for choosing the program. The applicant can articulate realistic, achievable, and relevant goals to the program's content and context. The applicant must also demonstrate why they want to participate in the program and avoid generalities (e.g., study abroad is a requirement, was recommended to them, or is something they have always wanted to do).

Clear Unmet Educational Need

Petitions must clearly articulate how and why the non-approved program meets an educational need that cannot otherwise be met through one of Pitzer's approved programs.
